- Reader Bag – students require a reader bag that can be purchased from the school uniform supplier. Students will utilise the reader bag for the entire time they attend Seaholme Primary School.

Payment methods

The preferred method of payment is via Compass for all contribution payments. This provides instant confirmation of payment and visibility of all contributions made. Credit/Debit cards can also be accepted at the school office.

Refunds

Parent requests for refunds are subject to the discretion of the school and made on a case-by-case basis. Refunds will be provided where the school deems it is reasonable and fair to do so, taking into consideration whether a cost has been incurred, the Department's Parent Payments Policy and Guidance, Financial Help for Families Policy, and any other relevant information.

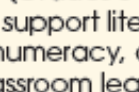
School Contribution

Whilst schools receive some Government funding, your support through voluntary school contributions plays a vital role in enriching our children's education experience.



What does my yearly School Contribution support?

At the beginning of each school year, this contribution will appear in the Compass app and subsidise essential resources beyond the basics provided by government funding, such as:

 Everyday classroom stationery for all students. 	 Art, STEM and PE materials to explore creativity, healthy exercise and classroom projects. 	 Digital learning resources like Reading Eggs, Mathletics, and iPad leasing (Grades 3-6) to support literacy, numeracy, and classroom learning. 	 Wellbeing programs to promote resilience, inclusion, and a positive school culture. 
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Additional Voluntary Financial Contributions

These are voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items that support the school's functions.

A general contribution goes towards:

-  **School grounds** for maintenance and improvements
-  **Communication tools:** Compass, newsletter, website
-  **First aid and hygiene supplies**
-  **Student wellbeing resources**

Other items:

-  **Community Support Contribution** to help students in need attend camps and excursions.
-  **Building Fund Donation** is optional and tax-deductible. As an example, these funds have supported replacing heating and cooling units.
-  **Extra-Curricular Items and Activities:** These are user pays items and activities that are "above and beyond" the standard curriculum. The costs for these, which include camps, excursions, and a swimming program, will be advised throughout the year.

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the requirements of the Curriculum. This includes the Victorian Curriculum F-10, the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) and the Victorian Pathways Certificate.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
